The Bad Tempered Ladybird

This week we are learning all about ladybirds and our story of the week is 'The Bad Tempered Lady Bird' watch the story here:

Monday

Normally we would start our week by creating a story map. This week for something different I would like you to have a go at writing a little book review. There is a template saved in the literacy folder to help you but you can create your own. Remember to write and draw about the characters, the setting, the beginning, the middle and the end.

Tuesday

Today have a go at choosing one character from the story and describe it. Remember to write at least 3 sentences describing your character. See if you can remember your capital letters and full stops!

To help you it is a good idea to draw the character before you begin to write and think carefully about how they look and about their personality. Think about the ladybird- are they calm and patient? Maybe you could use the word grumpy, or impatient?

Wednesday

Today you are going to think carefully about the settings in the story. Choose a setting in the story, there are lots to choose from you could pick where the firefly's were dancing in the moonlight, or where the lady bird met the wale?

Remember to write at least 3 sentences and use you full stops and capital letters.

Thursday

Now we are going to focus on a main events in the story. What did the lady bird try to do in the story? Why do you think that is? Remember to write at least 3 sentences and use your full stops and capital letters.

Friday

Now its time to rewrite the story of 'The Bad Tempered Ladybird' in your own words. It is quite a long story so you do not have to write each of creatures the ladybird met along the way but it is a

good idea to choose a couple of examples. Use your book review from monday, and your other writing from this week to help your story writing.
