## Values

## Reading at Home

Please try to read with your child at home as regularly as possible. Ideally this should be 10-15 minutes a day, which could involve both you reading to them and them to you.

## Homework

We will change home reading books on Tuesdays and Fridays, so please bring them back on those days in order to get a different one.

The homework diaries are a space for you and/or your child to record the reading they are doing at home. This can just be a quick note saying what they've read and perhaps something they enjoyed or found interesting in the book.

Writing and maths homework will be sent home on a Friday and needs to be returned on Tuesday.

## Spellings

Spelling tests are every 4 weeks. Children will be given spellings to practice every Friday. It is important that the children practise.

These are some of our focus sounds this term: ie (tie), ir (girl), ai (rain), igh (light), oy (boy).

The common exception words they will be tested on are: **was, said, your, where, there**.

## English

In writing our focus text will be '**Lila and the secret of rain**'



We will:

- Read and retell the story with actions and a story map
- Write an adventure story
- Write a setting description

We will continue to focus on our year 1 writing targets making sure we are starting our sentences with capital letters and ending them with full stops.

The children will also begin to use exclamation marks and question marks to punctuate their writing. As well as using time conjunctions to order the events in their stories and writing.



## Maths


This term we will focus on:

- Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s
- 2D and 3D shapes
- Breaking numbers into 10s and 1s



Breaking numbers into 10s and 1s is one of the most important things we will learn this year.

You can support by discussing what each digit 'really means', e.g. "does the '1' in 14 really mean just 1?" Explain that the 1 represents 1 ten. You can also use drawings of the dienes blocks that we use in school to represent numbers or support calculations.



## Science

In science, our topic is **Everyday Materials**.

Our key question is: **What is the best material to make wellies out of?**

We will start by exploring different objects and identifying which materials they are made from.

We will then move on to learning about the properties of different everyday materials.

The children will investigate which materials float and which materials sink and why.

The children will gain a concrete understanding when we use the story, 'The Three Little Pigs' to explore what materials are used for different purposes.



## Art

Our art topic this term was **textiles**. To link in with Black History Month we created pieces of art inspired by the **kente** cloth.

To create our pieces we weaved coloured card, alternating colours to make a repeating pattern.

To complete our cloths we drew similar designs to those used on the kente cloth.



## Topic

Our new topic this half term is '**UK and Kenya**',

Our key question is:

**Why is the weather in the UK different to Kenya?**



Our focus is geography and we will be learning about:

- Human and physical geography
- The world map and where our families are from and locating Kenya and the UK
- Life in Kenya- similarities and differences to the UK
- Weather patterns and the climate in Kenya
- The equator
- Maps and how to use them



## PE

We will continue to have PE on a **Thursday**.

This term we will be focusing on **gymnastics**.

Please make sure that your child has the correct school PE kit for the session.



## R.E

To begin this half term our key question is:

**Nativity Characters: Which character are you? Why are you important?**

We will learn about:

- Bible stories - The Nativity Story
- What Christians believe about the Nativity
- The importance of the characters, who they were, and how they impacted on the lives of others
- Christian living, the Church, ordinary people
- Belonging and the importance of love, tolerance, respect and faith.
