In RE this half term, we will be focusing on the key question:

## Science

Our science unit this half term is:

### 'Living things and their habitats'

We will be conducting practical scientific enquiries every lesson and learning all about:

- The structure of a flowering plant
- The functions of different parts of a flowering plant
- The life cycle of a plant
- Reproduction in flowering and non-flowering plants
- The life cycles of insects, amphibians, mammals and birds

Key vocabulary we will be using is: reproduce, sexual, fertilises, live young, metamorphosis, asexual, plantlets, bulbs, cuttings, gestation

At home, you could try growing your own plants from taking cuttings.



## English

We will be beginning the academic year by studying **fairy tales**. With a focus on **Hans Christian Andersen's, 'The Little Matchstick Girl'**. We will be studying the main features of and writing our own versions this classic fairy tale .

After studying fairy tales, our class reader will be: **'Empire's End—A Roman Story'** by **Leila Rasheed**



Our writing will be based on our class reading and our learning in history. We will start with writing an information text on The Roman Empire and then write a diary entry.

Our SPAG focuses will be:

- The difference between a phrase and a clause
- Recognising main and subordinate clauses
- Writing complex sentences using a range of punctuation
- Using prepositional phrases as sentence starters

## History

This half term in history, we are learning about:

### 'The Romans'

We will be focusing on:

- The invasions of Roman Britain
- The Roman Empire and its demise
- Roman emperors
- Life in the Roman army
- Life as a Roman in Roman towns and the countryside
- Hackney in the Roman times

Key vocabulary we will be using is: empire, invade, conquer, century, polytheism, emperor

I can't wait to see the amazing humanities homework you will complete on the Romans—the best pieces of homework will be added to our humanities classroom display.



## Maths

The fundamentals that we will be focusing on this half term are:

### Place Value

\*Reads, writes, orders, compares up to 1,000,000 (knowing value of each digit).

\*Reads Roman numerals to 1000 (M) (recognising years in Roman numerals.)

### Addition and Subtraction

\*+ - whole & decimal numbers more than 4 digits (including using column method).

In year 5, children are expected to be very fluent with their timetables and division facts up to 12x. This facilitates their learning of more complex skills that occur in the year 5 curriculum.

Please take any opportunity you have to practice times tables with your child.
