Amazing work...

As part of this terms RE topic 'Celebrations' **Nursery** went on a trip to TESCO to buy ingredients to make and bake a celebration cake. Before they went they discussed what a recipe was and made a shopping list for the ingredients they will need to purchase on their trip. The children made predictions with what they thought might happen when the batter was put into the oven and some of the children guessed the cake batter will get bigger (rise). The class had lots of fun baking the cake and enjoyed eating it.



This week in **Reception**, the class were able to visit St John's church. Most of the children had never been before so it was an exciting time of exploring the main sanctuary, prayer chapel and even having a cheeky practice of their Christmas songs. In RE they have been learning about the Nativity story and how they prepare for Christmas. The children have been using their class Nativity story to act out what they have learnt. They learnt Advent is about preparing to celebrate remembering the birth of Jesus. The class have spent time wondering about how Mary, Joseph and other characters in the story prepared for baby Jesus to be born.





This week for their STEAM topic, **Year 1** have been asked to design a bridge for the three billy goats gruff. The bridge had to be 20cm in length, be able to withstand the weight of the three goats and fit into a countryside setting.

In science this week, **Year 4** continued to develop their knowledge of circuits and electricity by exploring a range of complete and incomplete circuits. 








Year 5 have been working on their STEAM project this week, where they got to make moving toys! STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths. In this lesson, they focussed on Art and the children worked in partners to create appealing designs for their moving toys (which was also one of the design criteria of their product). They worked superbly in partners, working collaboratively, sharing resources and communicating effectively, as well as solving a variety of problems as they arose in their project. Well done year 5!



Year 6 have loved their STEAM work this week. They used their science topic about light to build on their prior knowledge and make periscopes! They learnt about light reflection and refraction and used their mathematical understanding of angles and parallel lines to produce their final products. They then evaluated their final piece and thought about how they could improve their work if they had another opportunity to do this project.
