

Maths



Last term we learnt how to sort and group real objects and pictures by different categories. We learnt to use a range of words to describe these comparisons and we also know how to recreate, continue and create our own repeated patterns. We looked closely at the numbers 0-5 and mastered our understanding of how they are made, what they look like and how to form the numerals. We also looked at 2d shapes.



This half term we will consolidate previous learning and looking in depth at the numbers the numbers 6, 7, 8 & 9.

We will learn to represent these numbers and quantities in different ways, to form each number and to count forward and back to 20.



We will consolidate understanding one less and one more as well as simple addition and subtraction with numbers 1-9. We will continue to develop our understanding of time, now including months and days of the week.

We will also look more closely at ways to measure length and height.



Mindfulness

We continue to do mindfulness everyday in our class. The children learn special strategies to help them regulate their breathing, their feelings and support their wellbeing.

Welcome to 2022 in Reception at SJSJ! We hope you had restful break and enjoyed the time at home with your children.

This newsletter will give you some information about what our learning will cover this half term.

The topics this half term in Reception are
'Winter' and 'Animals'

We will build on our learning of the seasons and categorise the changes we notice as we experience Winter.

In our first focus text we will meet a penguin who lives in the most 'wintery' place of all— Antarctica. We will compare what winter is like in our country and in other parts of the world.

Our other focus texts follows characters who meet a number of different animals on their journeys. We will learn about the animals we have around us in London and other animals found in different parts of the world.



In PE will focus on learning to control our bodies particularly with catching, throwing, balancing and climbing. In RE we will explore why Jesus is special to Christians and learn about some of the important things he did and stories he told.



Literacy

In Literacy we will focus on story structure, hearing initial sounds in words and rhyming strings.

Our focused texts are:

Blue Penguin, The Gruffalo and Handa's Surprise.

By the end of the term the children will be able to



recall these stories using words and actions.

As their phonic knowledge and confidence grows they will begin to independently more write using the stories as inspiration.

In writing we will build our ability to independently write CVC words using the sounds we know and our red words. We will access a wide variety of mark making activities including drawing and painting. You can help at home by continuing to read everyday with your child and giving them plenty of opportunities to write at home. Why not support them to write your shopping list or a letter to someone they care about?
