Humanities Focus: History

This term we will be basing our learning around the exciting topic of

PSHE



Our values focus this half term is: Being Me and My World.

We will be reflecting on our achievements and how to recognise different emotions in ourselves and others. We will then look at why rules are important and how they relate to rights and responsibilities.

Maths

This half term, we will be focusing on place value. We will learn to read, write, order and compare numbers up to 1,000,000, knowing the value of each digit.

We will also expand on our knowledge of Roman numerals, learning to recognise numerals up to 1000 (M).

We will also cover addition and subtraction. We will add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits using column method, including regrouping.

In year 5, children are expected to be very fluent with their times tables and division facts up to 12x. Please practise on Times Table Rockstars each night.

RE

This half term out learning will aim to answer this key question - What do the miracles of Jesus teach?

We will learn about the core concept incarnation, understand a variety of miracles performed by Jesus and explain how these tell us that Jesus is the Son of God.
