# 123

Last half term we learnt how to sort and group real objects and pictures by different categories. We learnt to use a range of words to describe these comparisons like smaller, taller, and heavier. We also learnt how to recreate, continue and create our own repeated patterns. We looked closely at the numbers, 1, 2 and 3. We mastered our understanding of how they are made, what they look like and how to form the numerals. We also looked at shapes with 1, 2, or three sides.




This half term we will consolidate previous learning and looking in depth at the numbers the numbers 4 and 5. We will learn to represent these numbers and quantities in different ways, to form each number and to count forward and back to 20.



We will be exploring positional language, one less and one more as well as beginning

to learn simple addition and subtraction with numbers 1-5. We will



explore what 0 is and begin to look at the time.

We will also become familiar with shapes that have 4 and 5 sides.

## Mindfulness

We continue to do mindfulness everyday in our class. The children learn special strategies to help them regulate their breathing, their feelings and support their wellbeing.

The topics this half term in Reception are  
**'Journeys' and 'Materials'**

We will begin to understand that everything is made of different materials. We will look closely at some common materials like wood, metal, fabric, plastic and glass. We will use this knowledge to design and improve our own constructions.






In the focus texts we will meet characters who go on journeys both literally and in their imaginations.

We will learn about some important holidays that are celebrated at this time of year including Diwali, Hannukah and of course Christmas. In RE we will explore why Jesus was such a special baby and why Christmas is special for Christians.



## Literacy

In Literacy we will focus on story structure, hearing initial sounds in words and rhyming strings. Our focused texts are *Rosie's Walk*, *Stanley's Stick* and *Astro Girl*.



By the end of the term the children will be able to recall these stories using words and actions.

They will begin to independently write about the stories, and as a class we will also create our own stories based on these books.

You can help at home by continuing to read everyday with your child and by orally retelling their favourite stories at home.

In writing we will practise writing simple CVC words using the sounds we know and our green and red words. We will access a wide variety of mark making activities including drawing, painting and writing.

## Home Reading

When you read with your child at home **please write a comment in the diary**. We encourage you to use this diary as an active dialogue between home and school to support their progress.

**Tuesday and Friday**

alongside their reading book so that we can acknowledge and reward
