

English

In writing our focus text will be 'Femi the Fox: A Pot of Jollof'



We will:

- Read and retell the story with actions and a story map
- Write a setting description
- Write an instruction text

We will continue to focus on our year 1 writing targets making sure we are starting our sentences with capital letters and ending them with full stops.

The children will begin to use time conjunctions to order the events in their stories and writing. As well as this, we will focus on how to structure a simple sentence and the components needed to create a simple sentence, including the use of adjectives.

Maths

This term we will focus on:

- Counting in 2s and 10s
- 2D and 3D shapes
- Addition and subtraction, including Part Part Whole models

Ensuring fluency in addition and subtraction is very important in Year 1. We do this in a variety of ways, moving through a Concrete Pictorial Abstract method of teaching. You can help your child by using tens frames when solving addition and subtraction calculations, before moving them on to uscomplete the sentences to match the ten frame. ing numberlines to solve calculations.

Science

In science, our topic is **Everyday Materials**.

Our key question is: What is the best material to make wellies out of?

We will start by exploring different objects and identifying which materials they are made from.

We will then move on to learning about the properties of different everyday materials.

The children will investigate which materials float and which materials sink and why. The children will gain a concrete understanding through multiple investigations and experiments, as well as exposing them to popular stories such as The Three Little Pigs to contextualise learning.

Art

Our art topic this term is **textiles**. We have had great fun completing our weaving this week. To link in with Black History Month we created pieces of art inspired by the **kente** cloth.

To create our pieces we weaved coloured card, alternating colours to make a repeating pattern. To complete our cloths we drew similar designs to those used on the kente cloth.







Topic

Our new topic this half term is 'UK and Nigeria'.

Our key question is:

Why is the weather in the UK different to Nigeria?

Our focus is geography and we will be learning about:

- Human and physical geography
- The world map and where our families are from and locating Nigeria and the UK
- Life in Nigeria similarities and differences to the UK
- Weather patterns and the climate in Nigeria
- The equator
- Maps and how to use them

We will continue to have PE on a **Tuesday**.

This term we will be focusing on Tag rugby and tagging games.
