Humanities Focus: Geography

This term we will be basing our learning around the exciting topic: Hurricanes and Louisiana

We will be expanding our geographical knowledge and skills and answering the question - Why do some countries experience hurricanes and others don't?

We will begin by researching the state of Louisiana, looking at the culture and population and then comparing and contrasting it with the UK.
