Geography



This term we will be basing our learning around the exciting topic of Italy and Volcanoes!

In RE, our learning will be focussed around Christmas, considering the question -'What do Christians mean by peace at Christmas?'





Spanish

In grammar lessons, we will be focusing on:

- Adding figurative language, focusing on similes and metaphors

Maths

This half term, we will cover the concepts of area, multiplication and division.

The times tables we will be focussing on this half term are the 6s and 7s. Please continue to practise all times tables at home because it really helps!



<u>Multiplication and Division</u>

*Recalls X ÷ facts to 12x12 (including X ÷ by 1 & 0 and X 3 numbers together).

*Uses short X ÷ methods.

Measurement

*Understands how to measure area by counting squares

*Calculates area of squares and rectangles by multiplying

*Compares the area of different shapes

Oracy

Each week, we will have an Oracy lesson which aims to support the children's enquiry, critical thinking and communication skills.

The children will be working together and using their knowledge from the geography topic to discuss, debate and present an answer to:

How a Volcano Forms.
