Maths

Writing

The writing in Year 3 will continue to be inspired this half term by our history topic, Ancient Egypt. Our pieces of writing will be based on The Egyptian Cinderella by Shirley Climo.



We will be writing formal letters in the present perfect tense from the Pharaoh to his Egyptian people, informing them of his newly found Queen, Her Majesty Rhodopis! Our grammar focus' this half term will include using the present perfect tense, relative clauses and colons to introduce a list

PE

PE will continue to take place every Thursday afternoon. This term the focus is short tennis.

Please ensure that your child has the correct school PE uniform for each session.



Oracy

This half term, Year 3 will be debating the statement: Egyptian Society was unfair.

The children will use their new knowledge from our history lessons to form arguments for and against this statement.

They will then practise sharing their arguments using clear and audible voices and focusing on how body language can be used for a confident presentation.



PSHE Our values focus this half term is Healthy Me.

We will be learning about how to keep our minds and body healthy, keeping safe online and discussing the importance of safe and healthy choices.



We will be focusing on two units this half term: Fractions Mass and Capacity

Children will build on their understanding of dividing wholes equally to understand how fractions are used. We will compare and order fractions, and find out what fractions are needed to make a whole.

In the second topic, Year 3 will explore how mass and capacity are used and calculated. We will conduct investigations to determine whether taller containers have greater capacities than smaller containers.

Please continue to encourage your children to practice their times tables at home. A great way to do this is on Times Table Rockstars.



RE In RE we will be focusing on Christianity.

Our learning this half term will be guided towards answering our key question: Who was the most important person in the Easter story?

Throughout this topic we will be learning about key people in the Easter story and the impact they had on Jesus. We will then decide who we believe was the most important person and why.
