

Humanities - History

This half term we continue to learn about Ancient Maya as part of our history lessons.



We have started to make some links between cultural aspects of Mayan lifestyles by comparing them with other ancient civilisations, including Ancient Greece and Ancient Rome. We will now start to build on this by exploring religious aspects of the Mayan culture and consider how this has impacted world religions in the modern day.

PE

PE will continue take place on Friday.
This half term we will be focusing on Volleyball. It is essential that your child has the correct school PE uniform for each session.

Computing

In Computing this half term, the children will be building on their prior coding skills using the software, Hour of Code.



Maths

This half term in maths, we will be focusing on the following fundamentals: Algebra, Ratio & Proportion

- Uses simple formulae and generates and describes
- linear number sequences.
- Compares quantities using ratios.

<u>Fractions, Decimals & Percentages</u>

- +-X÷ fractions with diff. denominators and mixed numbers (simplest form) & recognises equivalent fractions.
- X ÷ by 10,100 & 1000 up to 3 d places.
- Calculates decimal fraction equivalents for a simple fraction.

<u>Timestable Rockstars</u>

Children should continue to use TTRackstars for 10 <mark>minutes</mark> every day - this is really important for securing their understanding of multiplication and number fluency.



Science

In science we will focus our learning around Animals including Humans. We will continue exploring the impact of external factors on our bodies, as well as looking at specific functions of key parts of our circulatory and respiratory systems.

Our key scientist this half term is Daniel Hale Williams, who was an African-American general surgeon and was one of the first doctors to perform open-heart surgery in America. He also helped set up a multi-racial hospital in America.

RE and PSHE

In RE lessons, we will be focusing on the celebration of Easter for Christians. In PSHE lessons we will be revisiting 'Healthy Me' as we discuss the importance of taking personal responsibilities for our choices and exploring different ways to manage our stress levels and support our mental health.

Home Reading

Children are expected to read for at least 20 minutes each night and make a record of this in their home reading journals. It is important that children record the title, author and the page numbers of the section read, as well as a brief summary.

Reading books and journals must be brought **into school daily** as these will be checked every morning.

Writing

In writing this half term, we will continue reading *Macbeth, by Wil*liam Shakespeare.



We will be using key parts of the storyline to inspire us to write balanced arguments, character descriptions and retells with alternative endings.

Each cycle of writing will provide us with an opportunity to introduce and develop new grammar skills, including:

- parenthesis
- -ed clauses
- direct speech

Spelling Shed

The regular use of Spelling Shed last half term had a very positive impact, so please ensure that children continue to log in for at least 10 minutes every day.

All assignments, past and present, will remain online for children to access across the school year.

Spelling tests will continue to take place weekly on Fridays.
