Last term we consolidated previous learning and looked in depth at numbers to 0-10. We learnt to represent these numbers and quantities in different ways, to form each number and to verbally count forward and back to 20 in 1s and in 10s to 100.

We consolidated understanding one less and one more and introduced the + and = sign to support simple addition with numbers

garden. Our second key text will lead us into discoveries about mini-beasts, worms and other creepy crawlies we can find around us in



London. We will learn how they grow and how they are essential to

humans flourishing. In **PE** we will continue to focus on learning to control our bodies with catching, throwing, balancing and climbing. In **RE** we will learn about God the creator of our

wonderful world and how we can help keep it special. Through this we will touch on the problem of plastic pollution, particularly in oceans and what all of us (4 and 5 year olds too!) can do to help.

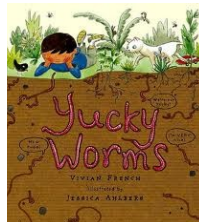
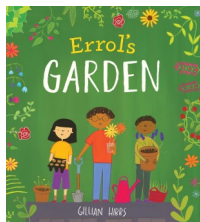

Literacy

In Literacy we will focus on story structure, hearing all the sounds in words, using tricky words and special friends in our sentences and letter writing.

Our focused texts are: *Errol's Garden*, *Yucky Worms* and *Clean Up*.



By the end of the term the children will be able to confidently speak and write about these books. Children will be able to write more independently using finger spaces and capital letters at the beginning of sentences.

Through our creative area and writing table we will access a wide variety of mark-making activities including constructing, drawing and painting.

You can help at home by continuing to read everyday with your child and giving them plenty of opportunities to be creative and write at home.

Home Reading

When you read with your child at home **please write a comment in the diary**. This diary should be an active dialogue between home and school. Children who are not reading everyday are likely to struggle in Y1. Your home reading is *essential* to their future success in Literacy and so many other areas, so thank you for making this a priority.

Reading diaries must be returned every Tuesday and Friday alongside their reading book so that we can acknowledge and reward their reading at home. Don't forget that 2 children each half term get to attend the Reading Tea Party. Your support at home will make all the difference to their progress AND chances to win!
