Computing


This half term in computing, we will be developing our photo editing skills using Word. This will allow to understand how and why we modify pictures.


Humanities—Geography

This half term, we will be learning all about North and South America

Our key question this half term is: What is the difference between North and South America?

We will begin to build on our knowledge of places in the world by identifying the different countries and time zones in each continent. We will then begin to explore the many states of the U.S.A. From this, we will look at the different climates within each continent and then compare between the two





We will also be developing our field work skills by conducting a local area study of Hackney; this will allow us to make comparisons between places in different continents.

Science

In science, our topic is 'Sound'.

This half term, we will be learning about how sounds are made and how they travel from the source to us. We will also study sound waves and how they can be affected by pitch or volume. Our unit also includes enquiries, where we will discover the effect of distance on volume and successful ways to soundproof the music room

We will use a range of instruments to explore how sounds can be manipulated to create different volumes and pitches. We will also find out about how vibrations are translated into messages to allow us to communicate.
