More details about the set up of SATs week will follow in a letter in due course, but in the meantime if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to see me.




# Dates for the Diary

## Spelling Shed

The regular use of Spelling Shed last half term had a hugely positive impact, so please ensure that children continue to log in for at least 10 minutes per evening. Spelling tests will now take place EdShed weekly on Wednesdays.

## Homework and Home Reading

Mathletics and Spelling tasks will be updated every Friday. Additional homework and answers will be uploaded to Google Classroom every Friday - these are optional tasks. These will not be marked in school, but I will manitor engagement.

It is essential that your child engages with all of these tasks to ensure that they have an opportunity to secure their learning.

Children are expected to read for at least 20 minutes each night and make a record of this in their home reading journals. It is important that children record the title and author, as well as a brief summary of what they have read. Reading books and journals must be brought into school daily as these will be checked every morning.

In Computing this half term, the children will be building on their prior multimedia skills by using a range of the Microsoft Office programs.




#### Maths

### Science


Our science unit this half term is: 'Evolution and Inheritance'



Our key question for this topic is: Why do I look similar but not identical to my family members?

Through our enquiry-based science curriculum, we will be asking and answering questions about the following areas:

- What can fossils tell us about species of the past?
- Why do I look similar but not identical to my family?



Our key scientist is Charles Darwin, who is very well known for his work in evolution and the close examining of how living things have changed over time.

#### RE and PSHE

In RE lessons, we will be focusing on the celebration and survival of the Christian message.



In Values, our unit theme is 'Relationships'. We will examine the different relationships we have with others in our community. We will also consider our relationship with Technology. This will link to how we stay safe online and the relationships we have with responsible adults, who we can speak to if we don't feel safe online.

## Writing

This term we will be focusing our writing around our new class text, 'Sky Song' by Abi Elphinstone. This is a majestic text about a magical, polar Kingdom called 'Erkenwald.'



Sky Song will inspire us to use our creativity and imagination as we explore the features of non-chronological reports. We will learn how to use presentational devices such as subheadings, bullet points, and diagrams to clearly organise information for the reader. We will also experiment with formal language and the subjunctive mood to convey authority and precision in our writing.

# Humanities - Geography

This term, we will be revisiting geography in humanities to learn about The Polar Regions; we will be focusing our learning



around the key question "How is Human Activity Affecting our Polar Regions?"

We will be learning about climate change how it is effecting the polar landscapes. We will think about how sustainable initiatives will support and protect some of the most threatened polar regions and the implications of these for the future of our planet. We will also learn about the human and physical geography of The Arctic and Antarctica through learning about land use, civilisations, wildlife and how to survive in such an extreme climate!
