Spelling Shed

This year the children will continue to use Spelling Shed to access weekly spelling words—log in details can be found inside the cover of home reader books.



It is expected that children use Spelling Shed for at least 10 minutes each evening—this will ensure that they are consolidating the spelling rules that we will be learning each week in our spelling lesson. Spelling tests will take place every Thursday.

Homework

Homework will be uploaded anto Google Classroom each half term. This will be a document that consists of the spelling, science and humanities questions that can be researched each week. Each week, you will receive a series of questions on the Mathletics app based on the previous week's maths learning.

A worksheet to consolidate the previous week's maths learning will be uploaded to Google Classroom each week, as well as the answers. There is also a video tutorial provided on Google Classroom so your child can recap strategies.

Home Reading

Children are expected to read for at least 20 minutes each night and make a record of this in their home reading journals. It is important that children record the title and author, as well as a brief description of what they have read.

Reading books and journals must be brought into school daily as these will be checked by an adult every morning.

Humanities—History

This half term we will be learning about World War II as part of our history lessons. We will be looking at the main events that occurred during World War II and the impact these had.

Maths

This half term in maths, we will be focusing on the Following fundamentals:



Place Value

- * Rounds any whole number to a required degree of accuracy.
- * Uses negative numbers in context & calculates intervals across 0 (+ and -).

Four Operations


- * Identifies factors & multiples finding all factor pairs & common factors.
- * Solves x + problems using factors, multiples, scaling, squares & cubes.
- * Knows and uses prime numbers, prime factors and composite numbers.

Timetable Rockstars

It is expected that children use TTRockstars for at least 10 minutes each evening—this will ensure accurate number fluency, which is a huge support for the children's arithmetic skills.

Science

In science we will focus our learning around Electricity.



Children will learn the basics of electrical

circuits, focusing on components like switches, bulbs, buzzers, and motors. By constructing simple series circuits, they will develop enquiry skills, experimenting to see how different components affect circuit function. They will also learn to pose questions, predict outcomes, and represent their circuits using standard symbols in diagrams.

PF

PE will take place an Fridays.
This half term we will be
focusing on basketball and
netball skills. It is essential that your child
has the correct school PE uniform for each
session.

RE and PSHE

In RE lessons, we will be focusing on the beliefs and traditions of Christians. We will be thinking carefully about what the journey of life and death looks like from different perspectives.

In PSHE, we will be thinking about 'Being me and my world,' as we discuss our own new beginnings and reflect on the ways that we adapt to the changes in our life. We will also incorporate opportunities for mindfulness as we aim to create stress free environments in our lives.

Art

In Art lessons this half term, we will be focusing on the following disciplines:

Painting: Children will be exploring the artist Gustav Klimt. They will be analysing his work to inspire their own self-portraits. We will also be looking at colour theory, including tints, tones and shades.

Printing: For our weekly Art lessons, we will be creating a print inspired by Yinka Shonibare.. We will be sketching print designs before using the lino print technique to create our prints

Writing



In writing this half term, we will be using our class text—The Silver Sword, by Ian Serrailier—to inspire us to write letters, setting descriptions and to retell events from a characters perspective.

For each cycle of writing we will be introducing and developing the following grammar focuses:

- Subordinate clauses
- Expanded noun phrases, with
- prepositions
- Fronted adverbials

During our publishing lessons we will be performing and sharing the parts of our writing that we are most proud of - keep an eye out for these!
