PSHE

Our values focus this half term is: Dreams and Goals.

We will be learning about what success means. We will also be setting ourselves personal goals.

Humanities - Geography

Our new topic this half term is

'UK and Nigeria'

Our key question is:

Why is the weather in the UK different to Nigeria?

We will be exploring:

- Human and physical geography
- The world map and locating important places on the map, including the UK and Nigeria
- Life in Nigeria—similarities and differences to the UK
- Weather patterns and the climate in Nigeria
- What the equator is
- How to use maps



English

In writing our focus text will be: **'Femi the Fox: A Pot**of Jollof



Children retell the story, write setting descriptions and instruction texts. We will continue to focus on our Year I writing targets making sure we are starting our sentences with capital letters and ending them with punctuation. The children will begin to use time conjunctions to order the events in their stories and writing. As well as this, we will focus on how to structure a simple sentence, using nouns, verbs and adjectives accurately.

Maths

This term we will focus on Place Value. We will be:

- Counting in 2s and 10s
- 2D and 3D shames
- Addition and subtraction including problem solving.

We will continue to consolidate our learning about Part Part Whole and place value with 10s and ls. Counting forwards and backwards in 2s and 10s. Children will work do this using concrete objects, pictorial representation, oracy and abstract complete the sentences to match the ten frame. representations

Reading and Phonics

Children read in school in groups using SFA. Please have them read to you 10 minutes a day. Books will be changed Tuesday and Friday.

We will be particularly focusing on: ue (glue), ai (train), igh (light), ow (snow), aw (claw) and oi (foil)

When reading together encourage your child to notice any of these sounds.

R.E

This half term our question is

Nativity Character: Which characters are

you? Why are you important?

We will be learning about The Nativity Story and what Christians believe about this story. We will explore the different characters and how they impacted the lives of others. We will also learn about Christian living, and the church. Our focus within this will be on belonging and the importance of love, tolerance, respect and faith.

Science

Our topic is Everyday Materials

Our key question this term is: What is the best material to make wellies out of?

We will start by exploring different objects and identifying which materials they are made from. We will then learn about the properties of different everyday materials.

Children will investigate which materials float and which materials sink and why. They will do a range of investigations and build on what they discover about everyday materials on their trip to the Science Museum.

PE

We will have PE every **Monday**. This term we will be focusing on tag rugby and other tagging games.
