

English



In writing, we will be using our focus text, *Moth* by Isabel Thomas, to inspire our writing.

Through our writing cycles, we will engage with different genres including:

- A story retell
- A non-chronological report
- An acrostic poem


We will continue to focus on starting all sentences with a capital letter and ending them with a full stop.

We will also introduce some new grammar concepts, including:

- The use of conjunctions to extend sentences
- The use of prepositions
- The correct use of exclamation marks and question marks

Maths

In maths lessons this half term, we will be focusing on:



- Recognising and comparing the properties of 2d and 3d shapes
- Understanding the composition of numbers 6–10
- Additive structures, including their commutative relationships

In arithmetic lessons, we will be focusing on:

- Number bonds to 10
- Finding one more
- Finding one less
- Comparing the value of numbers within 10
- Understanding doubles and halves

Science

In Science, our topic this half term is Animals including Humans.



Our Key Question is:

How are animals and humans different?

We will be focusing on classification of animals by learning to identify and categorise a variety of common animals, using their physical features and diets.

Our Key Scientist is:

Jane Goodall.

She is famous for her studies of chimpanzees and how they are closely related to humans. She also discovered that chimpanzees are omnivores.

PE lessons will continue to take place on Monday.

History



In humanities this half term, we will be learning and exploring all the past, through the 'The Industrial Revolution'.

Our Key Question is:

How did the Industrial Revolution change Britain?

We will be:

- Finding out what The Industrial Revolution was.
- Describing how Britain changed from a rural to industrial country.
- Understanding what life was like for a child in Victorian Britain.

R.E

This half term in RE, we will be learning about the World Faith, Judaism.



Our Key Question is:

What is it like to live as a Jewish person?

We will be exploring:

- Jewish symbols (Star of David, the Tora, etc)
- Jewish places of worship (synagogue)
- How Jewish people celebrate the Sabbath
- The Jewish community

As well as discussing what we learn about the Jewish faith, we will also have the opportunity to handle important objects and make comparisons across other faiths.
