


Computing

Humanities

Our new topic this half term is:
Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole



Our key question is:
How did Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole Change Healthcare?

We will begin our history unit by creating a timeline of the Victorian Era and understanding key historical events that took place during the Victorian Era. We will then use a range of primary and secondary sources to discover the key roles Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale played during The Victorian Era. We will use sources to make hypotheses about what they did and discuss the reliability of the sources we analyse.

The religion we will focus on this half term is:
Judaism

This half term we will be focusing on our key question:
Why are they having a party?

We will explore key festivals celebrated in the Jewish community and why they are significant. The festivals include Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot and Hanukkah.



Writing

This half term, our focus text will be:
The Extraordinary Life of Mary Seacole

We will have three key grammar focuses this half term:

- Subordinating conjunctions
- Figurative language
- Progressive tense forms



We will begin Spring 1 by writing a diary entry from the perspective of young Mary Seacole. We will then write our first pieces of poetry in Year 2, which will be a Haiku and Diamante poem describing Mary Seacole. Our final piece of writing for the term will be a biography, describing key events that took place in Mary Seacole's life during the Crimean War.

Maths

This term we will focus on:
Multiplication and Division

- Use repeated addition to understand multiplication
- Use the 2, 5 and 10 times table to solve maths problems
- Understand and use doubling

We will continue to focus on the **2** and **10 timetables** this term. Please use **Timetables Rockstars** to support the children further at home. You can find their logins on the login sheet that was handed out at the start of the year.



Reading Diaries

Every child will be given a new reading diary, which will be checked **daily**.

We will change home reading books on **Tuesdays** and **Fridays**, so please bring them back in order to get a different one. Please make sure your child is reading for 20 minutes each day. Please also encourage them to read aloud to someone when possible.



If your child is on **AR**, please encourage them to bring their AR books in when they have finished the whole book. They will then be able to take an AR comprehension test based on the book, and select a new book.
